

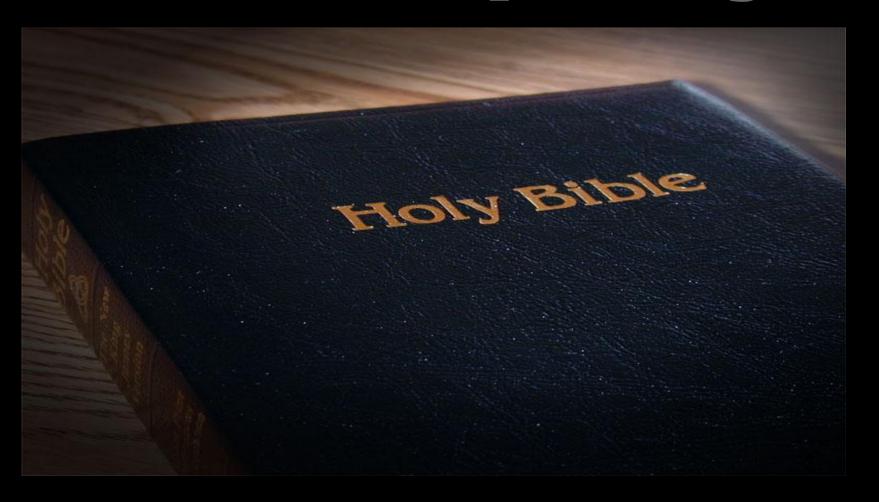
#### **Health benefits of Tarwi:**



## Proverbs - Jesus & Remnant: Godly Wisdom - Fear of the Lord




The key theme of the book of Proverbs is godly wisdom, which begins with the "fear of the Lord" and is applied to everyday life to promote a righteous and successful existence.

This practical wisdom is contrasted with folly and is expressed through various principles including discipline, hard work, responsible speech, and the importance of strong relationships.



The fear of the Lord: The book repeatedly states that "the fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge" (Proverbs 1:7). This doesn't refer to terror, but to a healthy reverence and awe for God, which serves as the foundation for all other wisdom.

Wisdom vs. Folly: Proverbs presents a clear contrast between the wise, who listen to instruction and embrace God's path, and the fool, who rejects counsel and goes their own way. Applying wisdom is presented as a choice that leads to a better life.



Practical application: Wisdom is not merely knowledge, but the ability to apply it in daily life. This includes making responsible choices, managing finances, and living a life of integrity and justice.

The power of speech: The book emphasizes the immense power of words, warning against harshness, gossip, and lies while praising gentle, truthful, and encouraging speech.



Hard work and diligence: Proverbs consistently promotes a strong work ethic and diligence, highlighting the negative consequences for the lazy and the rewards for the diligent.

Relationships: Building and maintaining strong, healthy relationships based on love, respect, and loyalty is another key theme. This includes the importance of a good marriage and wise friendships.




## 1 - Jesus in the book of Proverbs An example of Jesus' teaching

3. Jesus picks up seeds from the Proverbs and brings them into flower. So, he takes Proverbs 27:1 and clarifies and expands its challenge.

4. Like the spotlights of the Ten Commandments, so the lasers of the Proverbs target our sins and show our need for the grace of God in Christ.



## 1 - Jesus in the book of Proverbs An explanation of Jesus' death


5. The Proverbs describe the kind of scheming that characterised Jesus' crucifiers, Proverbs 1:10-12. They deepen our understanding of the curse of the Law that was borne by Jesus. They demonstrate the principles of penal justice that he would experience on our behalf.



## 1 - Jesus in the book of Proverbs The extent of Jesus' death


6. Proverbs is taken up with both the great things and the small things, showing that there is no corner of our lives – or of the entire cosmos – that Jesus does not claim as his own, and that he is not concerned to renew in humanity.

7. Proverbs repeatedly connects win with its consequences, presenting a foretaste of final judgment. See Proverbs 2:22; 22:3.

8. Just as Proverbs connects disobedience to the divine law with alienation from God, so it demonstrates the blessings that come from obedience. See Proverbs 4:7-9; 11:18.



## 1 - Jesus in the book of Proverbs An entrance into Jesus' home

9. In contrasting the houses of the wicked and the righteous, Proverbs provides an insight into our heavenly home that Jesus preparing for us right now.

'The righteous life and society envisaged by Proverbs make the believer yearn for the perfection of that condition and place that will be enjoyed only in the new heaven and new earth wherein dwell the righteous and righteousness.' See Proverbs 12:7; 15:6.



## 1 - Jesus in the book of Proverbs The exaltation of Jesus' glory

10. If the Proverbs show up our inability to keep God's law, then they point us to Jesus' perfections and salvation, and prompt us value him more and more highly.





## 1 - Jesus in the book of Proverbs Jesus a wise son

11. Proverbs 30:4 -Solomon's words to 'my son' would have suggested to Israel its status as God's 'son'. Her waywardness in this regard points to the 'true Israelite', the Son who would please his Father in every way.



## 1 - Jesus in the book of Proverbs Jesus a wise teacher

12. Solomon – wise in word but so often foolish in behaviour – points to One who was wise in both what he said and how he lived in the book of Proverbs.

13. Lady Wisdom's preparation of a feast (Proverbs 9:1-6) portrays a divine Host who calls sinners into table fellowship with him, just as Jesus did.







14. Proverbs 8 teaches the central role of God's Son in the word of creation a theme taken up in John 1:1-4 and Hebrews 1:1.

15. We rightly understand Proverbs 31 to celebrate the qualities of a godly woman. But the Israelites understood their covenant relationship with God in terms of a marriage, and they would also see in this chapter, then, a description of what the Lord had called them to be.


## 3 - Lessons from the Book of Proverbs I. The Foundation of Wisdom: Fearing the Lord

#### **Acknowledge God's Authority**:

Recognizing that God, not humanity, defines right and wrong is the essential starting point for a wise life (Proverbs 1:7; 9:10).

Hate Evil: Fearing the Lord means actively hating pride, arrogance, evil behaviour, and perverse speech, which naturally leads to obeying God and shunning evil (Proverbs 8:13; 16:6).

**Shun Self-Sufficiency**: It requires a posture of humility, acknowledging your place in the universe and not leaning on your own understanding (Proverbs 3:5-7).



## 3 - Lessons from the Book of Proverbs II. The Path of the Righteous: Wise Living

Seek and Trust God: Wisdom calls out to be sought after diligently (Proverbs 8:17). Trusting in the Lord with all your heart calms anxieties and provides a secure refuge (Proverbs 3:5-6).

Embrace Humility: Pride leads to disgrace and destruction, but humility brings wisdom and honor (Proverbs 11:2; 16:18). A remnant person accepts correction and is open to learning from others.


Maintain Integrity in Relationships: This involves being a loyal friend who loves at all times, honouring parents' instruction, and maintaining sexual integrity within marriage (Proverbs 17:17; 1:8; 5:15-20).



## 3 - Lessons from the Book of Proverbs II. The Path of the Righteous: Wise Living (cont'd)

Guard Your Heart and Speech: Since everything in life flows from the heart, it must be guarded with all diligence (Proverbs 4:23). This includes carefully choosing words, speaking truth, and avoiding a perverse or foolish tongue (Proverbs 13:3; 12:19).

Pursue Diligence and Justice: Hard work and good planning lead to prosperity, while laziness leads to poverty (Proverbs 10:4; 14:23). The remnant should also be passionate about justice, helping the poor and vulnerable, as this pleases God (Proverbs 29:14; 21:3).

III. The Mindset of the Remnant: Enduring & Hopeful


Focus on the Journey: Christian living is a journey where growth is important, and one must lean on God's strength, not their own, to overcome shortcomings.


Live as a Witness: The ultimate mission of the remnant is to share God's truth with a world that has turned to wickedness, urging others to turn to God and flee destruction.
