Weight Management: The high fiber content promotes satiety, meaning they keep you feeling full longer.

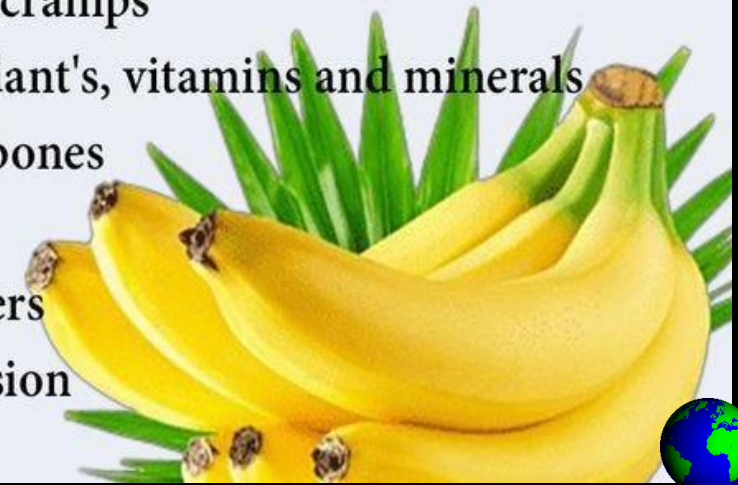

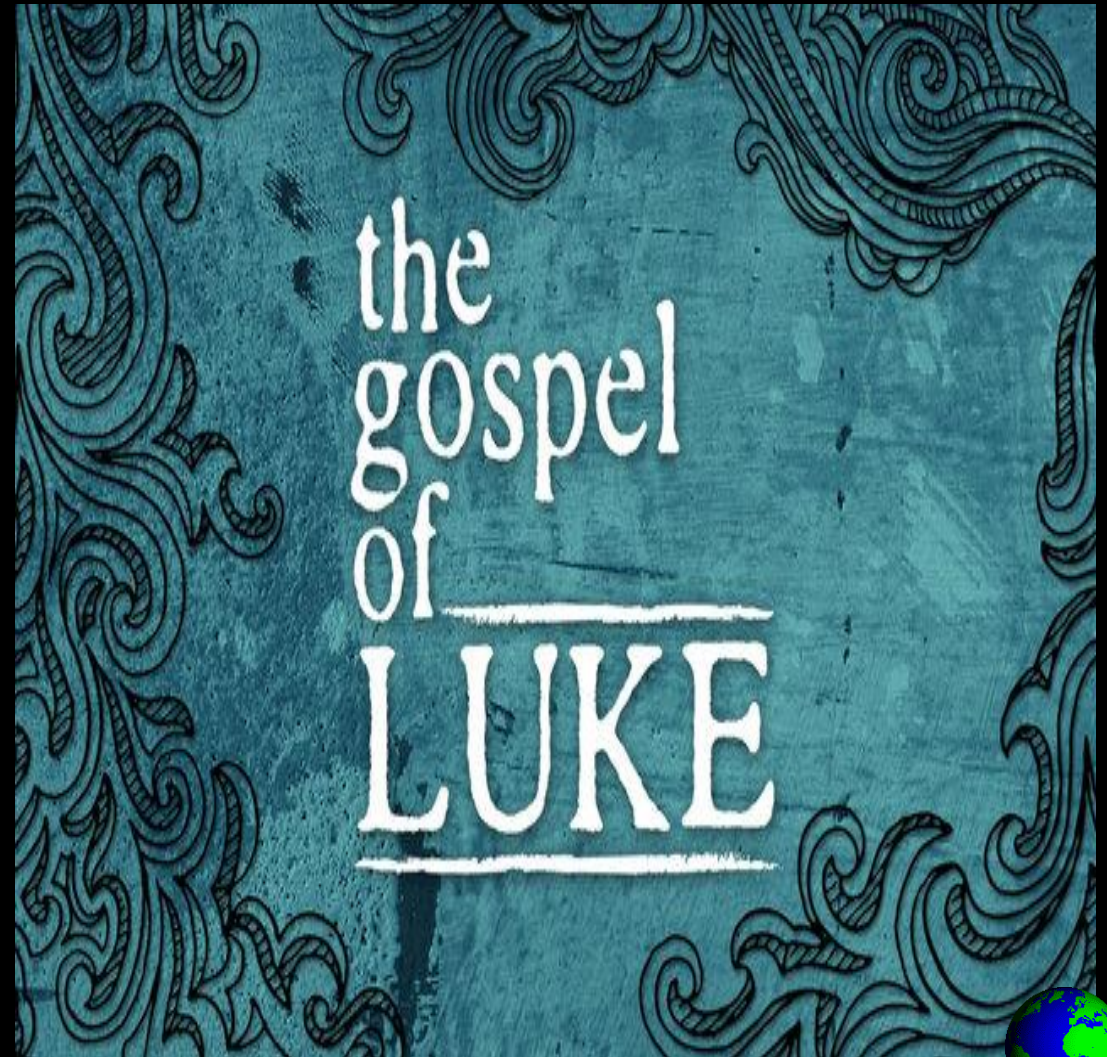
Introduction

1. *The Dawn of Salvation and Divine Prophecy (Chapters 1–3)*

Breaking the Silence: The Gospel opens with the miraculous births of John the Baptist and Jesus, ending centuries of prophetic silence.

Fulfillment of Prophecy: these chapters prove Jesus perfectly fulfilled Old Testament covenants and prophecies (e.g., the Davidic and Abrahamic covenants).

The Universal Savior: Luke's genealogy traces Jesus all the way back to Adam, rather than stopping at Abraham. This emphasizes that Christ's saving grace is meant for the entire human race, both Jews and Gentiles.



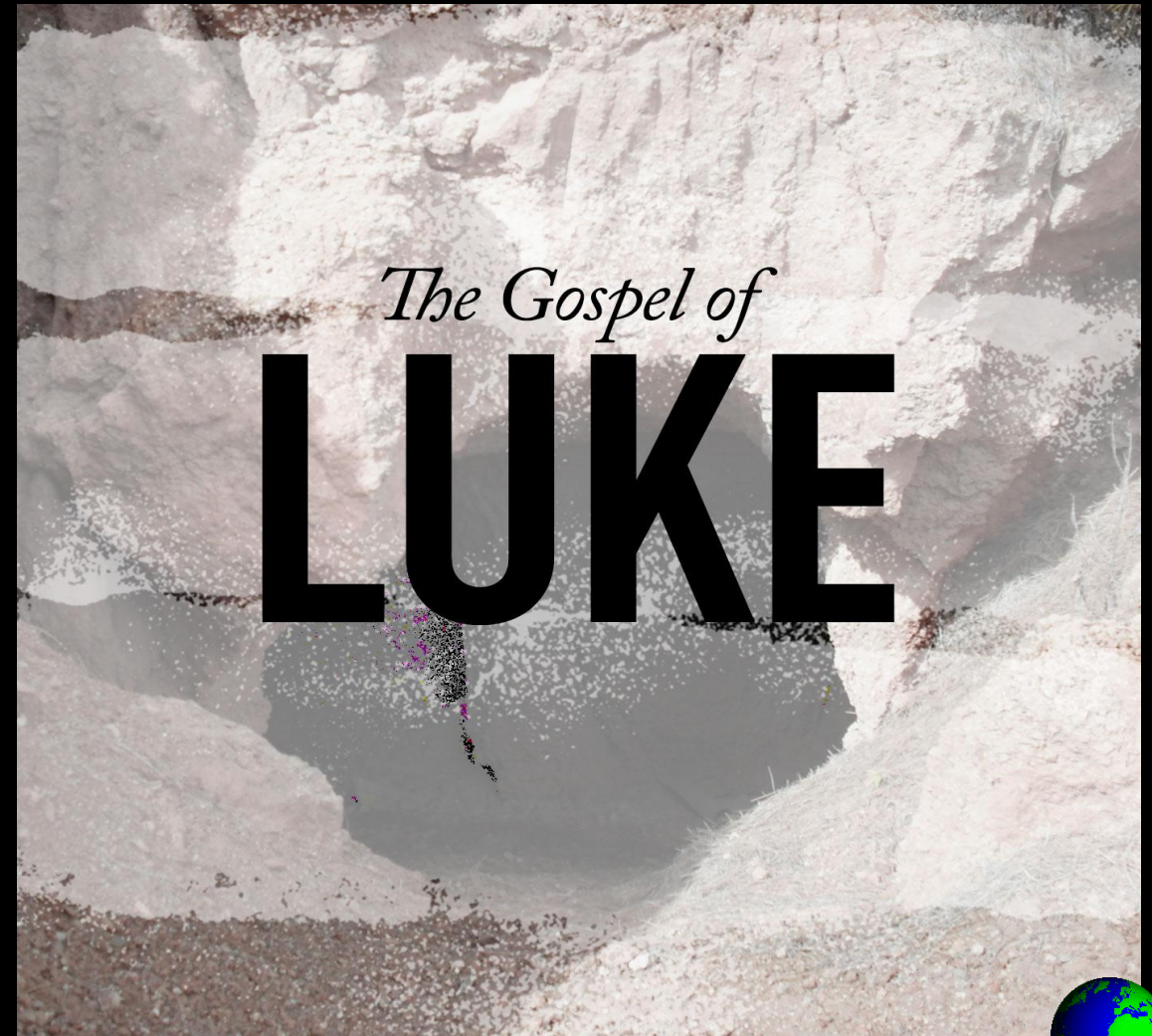

2. *The Nature of Discipleship and Ministry (Chapters 4–9)*

The Servant-Leader: Jesus announces His public ministry in Nazareth, establishing His mission to "preach the gospel to the poor" and "heal the broken-hearted".

The Holy Spirit's Power: From His baptism to His public teachings, Jesus is portrayed as fully relying on the Holy Spirit, providing a model for the believer's life and witness.

True Obedience: Through miracles—such as the miraculous catch of fish—Jesus calls His followers to leave their worldly dependencies and trust entirely in His transforming power.



Introduction

3. The Kingdom Mission & Radical Surrender (Chapters 10–12)

Participation in Mission: Jesus commissions the 70 disciples, demonstrating that following Him requires active involvement in spreading the good news of His Kingdom.

True Humility vs. Hypocrisy: In Chapter 12, Jesus warns His followers against the "leaven of the Pharisees, which is hypocrisy." This teachings emphasize that genuine faith requires absolute honesty, humility, and transparency before God.

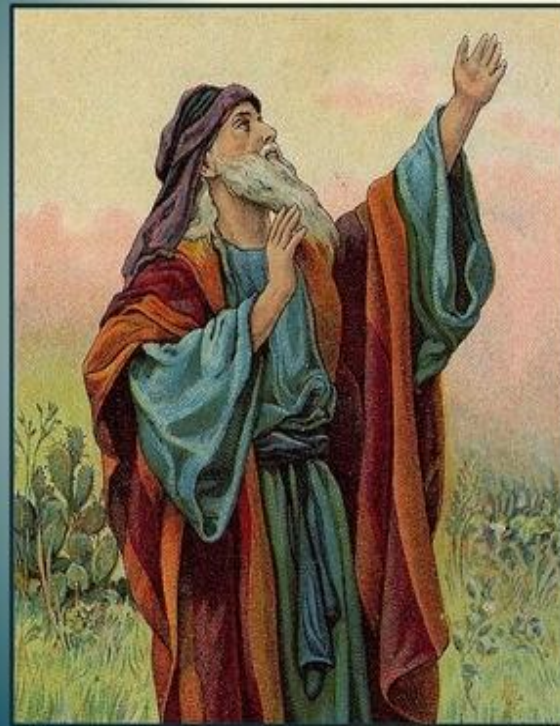
Fearing God Over Man: Jesus teaches His disciples not to be anxious about physical needs or the persecution of this world. He stresses that God's providential care is infinite, urging believers to be vigilant, watchful, and prepared for the Second Coming.

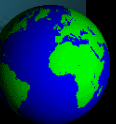

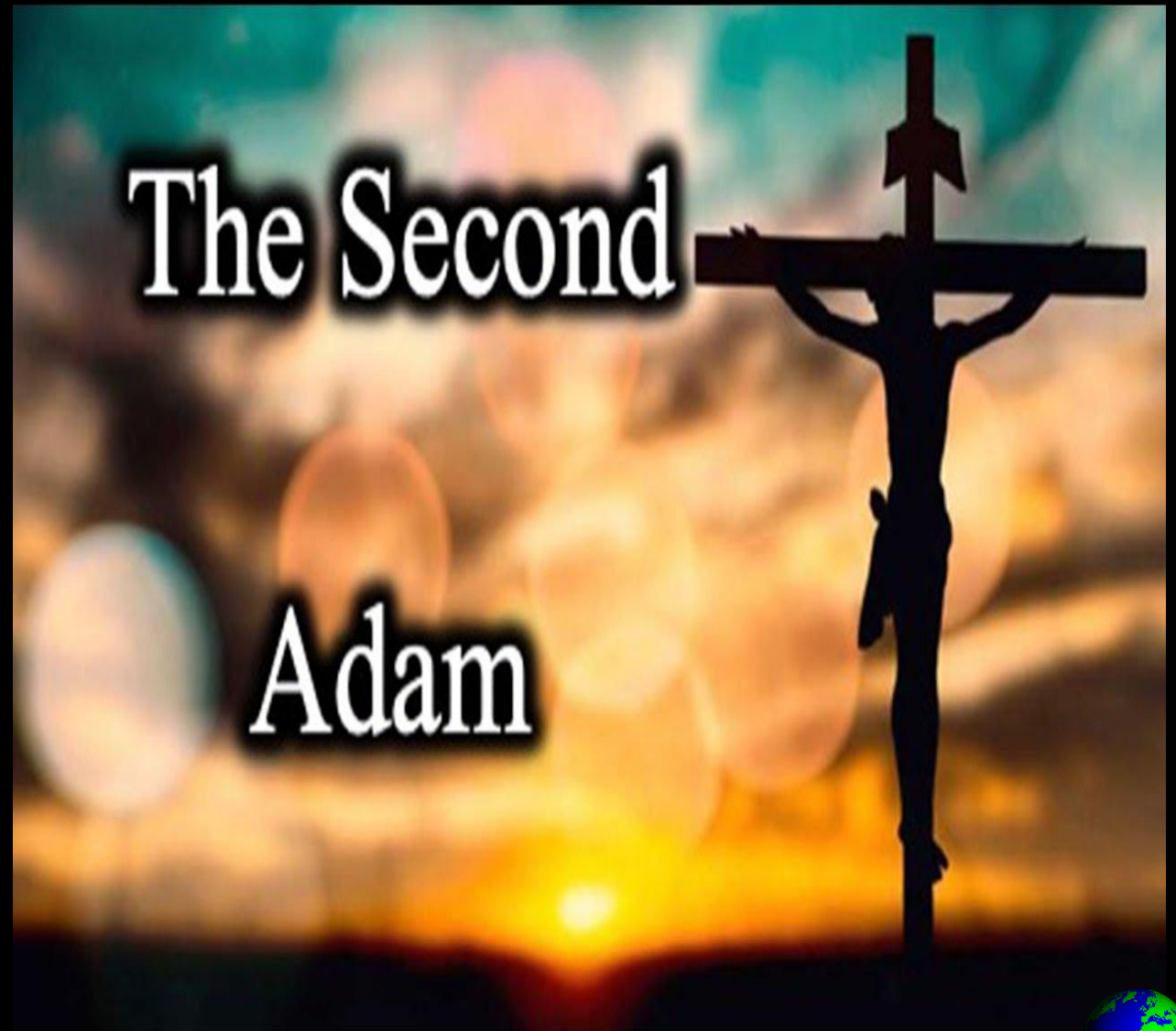

Jesus’ disciples began to pluck heads of grain from a grain field and to eat them on Sabbath (Mt. 12:1-2)

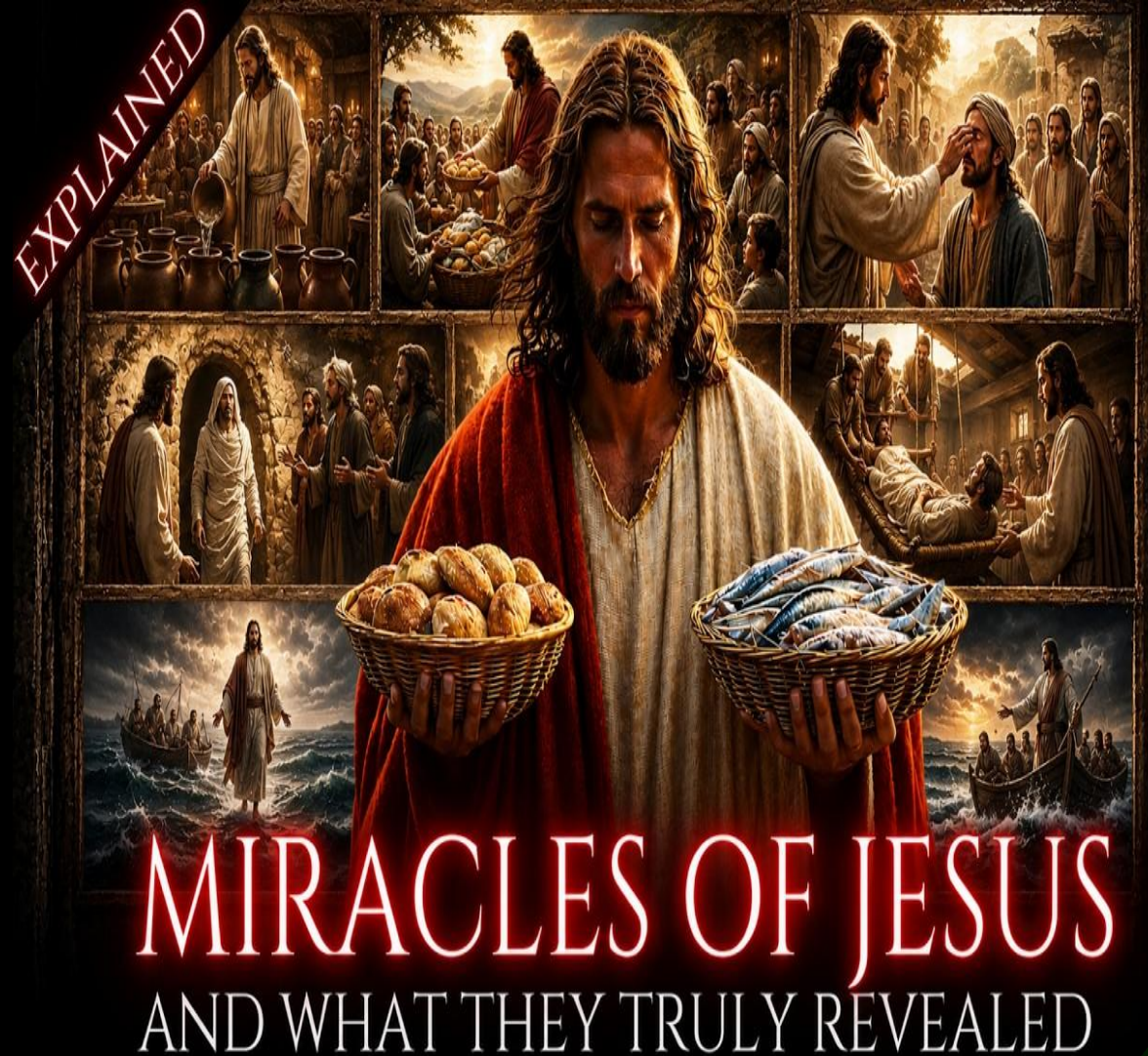
That was permitted by the law (Dt. 23:25), but they were accused of breaking the law by doing that on Sabbath.

3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

1. Faith Over Doubt and Unbelief (Luke 1–2)

Zechariah's muteness resulted from his disbelief in God's promise to answer his prayer for a son. Ellen G. White highlights that in ourselves, we are incapable of righteousness, but God works miracles in submissive, believing souls. Unanswered prayers are never an indication God is ignoring us, but often a set-up for a greater blessing in His perfect time.



3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

2. The Universal Reach of Salvation (Luke 3-4)

Jesus announces His mission at Nazareth by reading Isaiah, but quickly offends the religious elite by pointing out that God's blessings also reach Gentiles.

Luke emphasizes that Christ is the universal Savior. The Gospel is not for a privileged few, but for all, underscoring the belief in the worldwide proclamation of the Three Angels' Messages.

“ETERNAL GOSPEL”

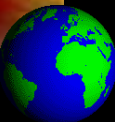
Revelation 14:6-13

⁶Then I saw another Angel flying directly overhead, with an **ETERNAL GOSPEL** to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation & tribe & language & people.

1 ⁷ & he said with a loud voice, “Fear God & give Him Glory because the hour of his judgment has come, & worship Him who made heaven & earth, the sea & the springs of water.”

2 ⁸ Another Angel, a 2nd, followed, saying, “Fallen, Fallen is Babylon the Great, she who made all nations drink the wine of the passion of her sexual immorality.”

3 ⁹ & another Angel, a 3rd, followed them, saying with a loud voice, “If anyone worships the Beast & its Image & receives a Mark on his forehead or on his hand, ¹⁰ he also will drink the Wine of God's Wrath, poured Full Strength into the Cup of his Anger & he will be tormented with fire & sulfur in the presence of the holy Angels & in the presence of the Lamb.”



3 - Lessons in the book of Luke

3. The Centrality of the Holy Spirit and Prayer (Luke 5–11)

Jesus models a life of utter dependence on God. He routinely withdraws to lonely places to pray before performing miracles, and He teaches the disciples how to pray.

The outpouring of the Holy Spirit was essential to Jesus' earthly ministry and is just as vital for believers today. [Luke 11:13](#) affirms that God is eager to give the Holy Spirit to those who ask.

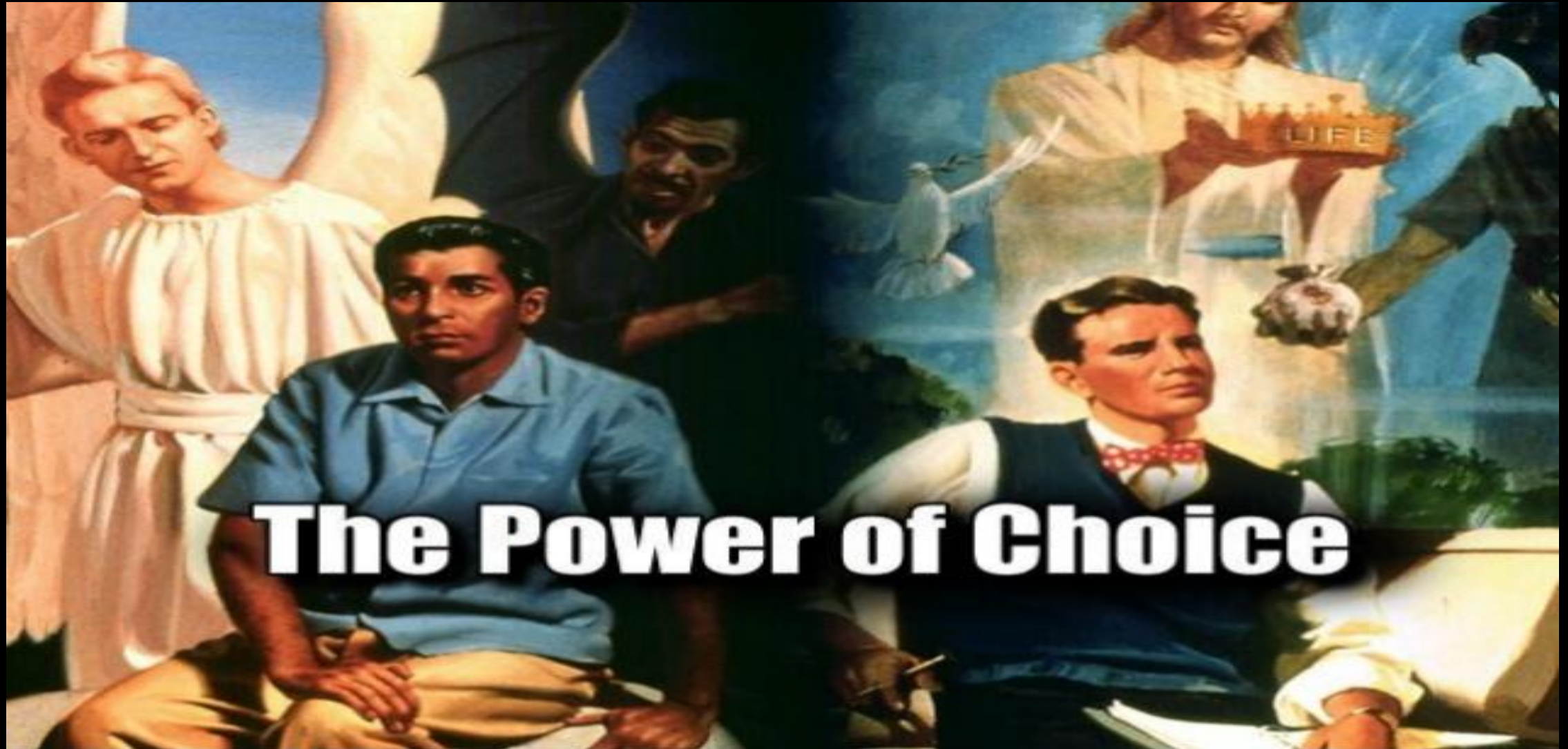
4. True Stewardship and Freedom from Anxiety (Luke 12)

In [Luke 12](#), Jesus warns against the "leaven of the Pharisees" (hypocrisy), the danger of greed (the Parable of the Rich Fool), and anxiety about material needs.

Adventists interpret this chapter as a call to prioritize eternal treasures over earthly hoarding. Because God provides for the birds of the air, believers are urged to seek the kingdom of God, living without fear and remaining watchful for the imminent return of Christ.



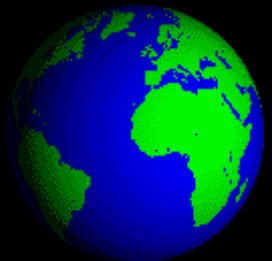

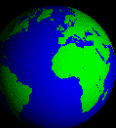
