Health Benefits of Bael (Seek Medical Advice)

Bael fruit (*Aegle marmelos*) is a nutritious, hard-shelled tropical fruit native to India and Southeast Asia. Often called wood apple, it contains a sticky, aromatic yellow-orange pulp with a sweet, tangy flavor.

Health benefit of Bael fruit:

Improves Digestive Health: Bael pulp contains tannins and pectin, which help balance gut health. It used to manage diarrhea, dysentery, and mild constipation.

Natural Body Coolant: a refreshing summer drink, it helps the body regulate internal temperature, prevents dehydration, and lowers the risk of heatstroke.

Immunity Boost: It has Vitamin C and antioxidants, which fight oxidative stress & against seasonal illnesses.

Supports Blood Sugar Management: Bioactive compounds in bael, like coumarins, are traditionally believed to assist in managing blood glucose levels.

Reduces Inflammation: The flavonoids and tannins present in the fruit have anti-inflammatory properties, managing internal swelling or joint discomfort.

Side effects: constipation or stomach upset or allergy

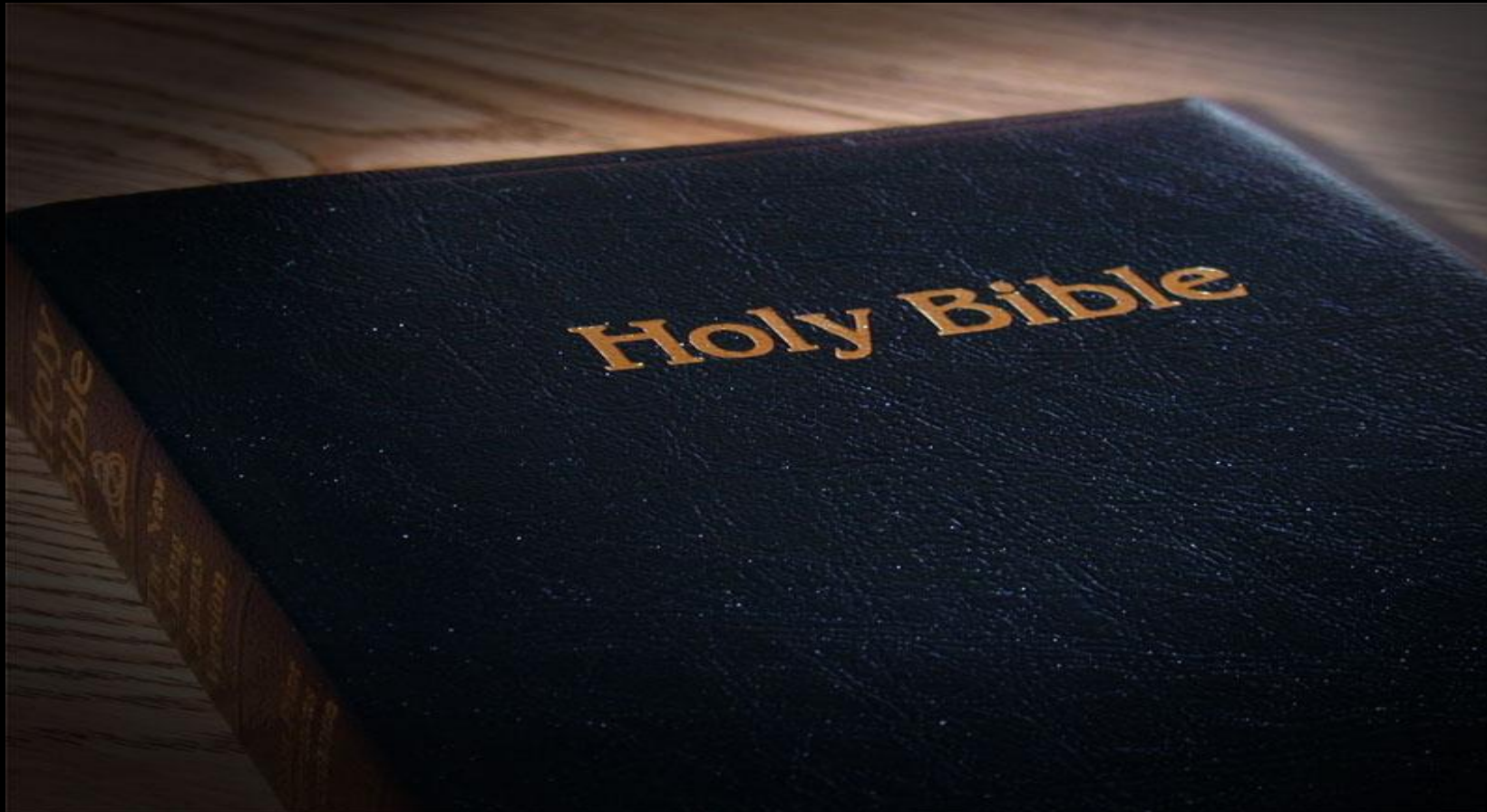

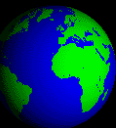

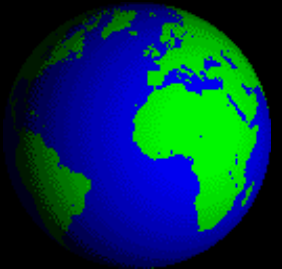

Introduction

Chapter 1: Paul introduces his letter, thanking God for the Corinthian believers' spiritual gifts while strongly rebuking them for their petty divisions and party spirit. The message of the cross is highlighted as the ultimate power of God, far superior to worldly wisdom.

Chapter 2: Paul reminds the Corinthians that his preaching was not based on human eloquence, but on the demonstration of the Spirit. True spiritual wisdom is revealed by the Holy Spirit and understood only by the spiritually mature.

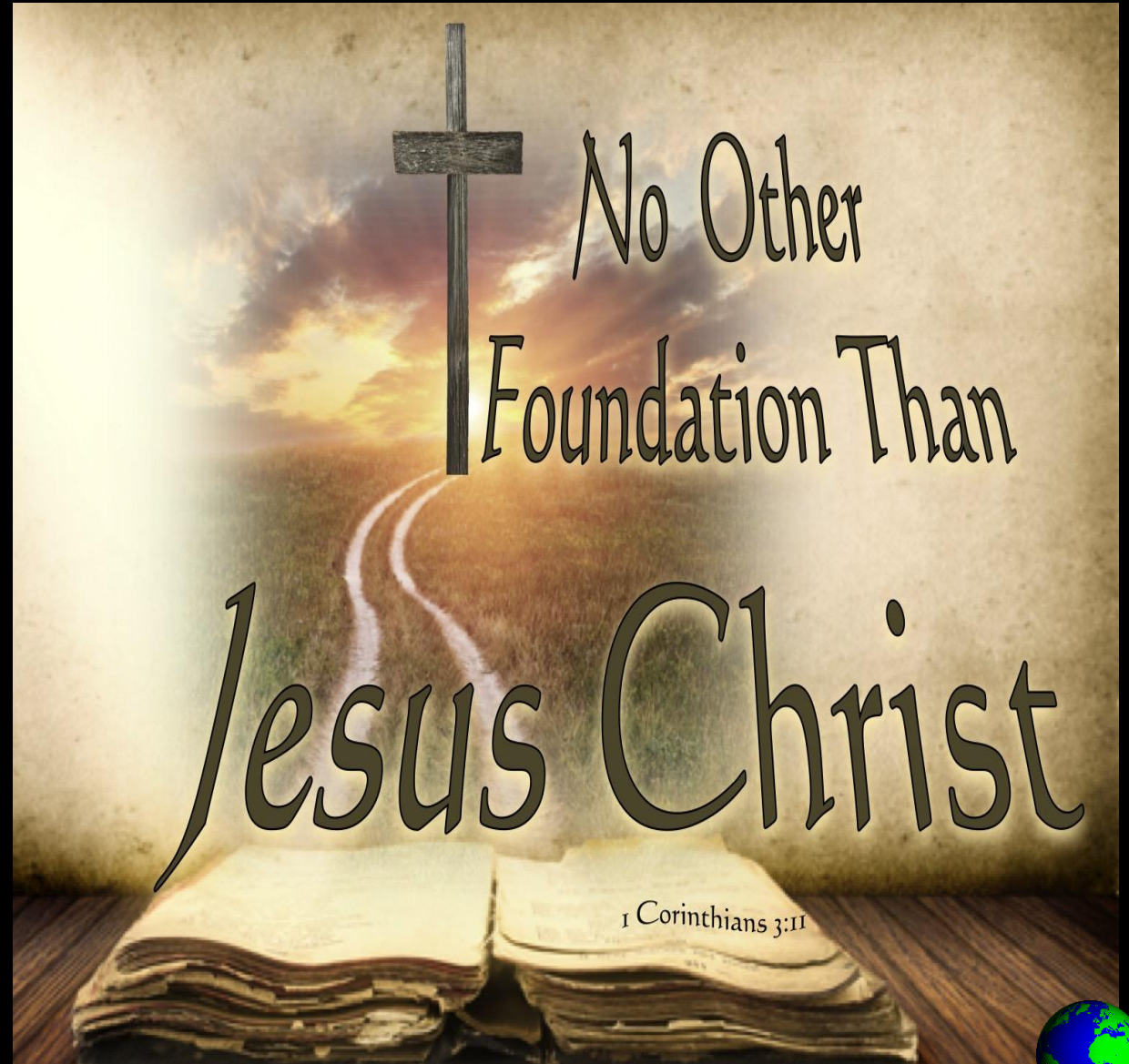

Introduction

Chapter 3: Paul addresses the Corinthians as "carnal" rather than "spiritual" because of their continued jealousy and strife. He emphasizes that church leaders are merely servants, and the church itself is the temple of God, which must be built upon the foundation of Jesus Christ.

Chapter 4: Paul elaborates on the stewardship of the apostles. He calls the Corinthians to humility, contrasting their arrogant pride with the suffering and self-sacrifice required of Christ's true ministers.



Introduction

Chapter 5: The church is rebuked for tolerating a severe case of incest. Paul commands them to purge the "evil" from among them through church discipline, emphasizing the need for moral purity within the body of believers.

Chapter 6: Paul condemns the practice of taking fellow believers to secular courts. He urges them to resolve disputes within the church and warns strongly against the prevalent sexual immorality of Corinth, reminding them that their bodies are the temple of the Holy Ghost.

Introduction

Chapter 7: Paul provides practical counsel regarding marriage, singleness, and divorce. He addresses the sanctity of the marriage covenant and counsels' believers to remain content in the calling where God found them.

Chapter 8: Addressing the issue of food sacrificed to idols, Paul introduces the principle of love over personal freedom. While an individual might have the "right" or knowledge to eat, they are expected to limit their freedom to avoid causing a "weaker brother" to stumble.

3 - Lessons in the book of 1 Corinthians

Preservation by Grace (1 Cor. 1:8-9): Paul reminds a deeply flawed church that their ultimate standing before God depends entirely on His faithfulness, not their perfection. The remnant is sustained by Christ's grace.

Rejection of Factionalism (1 Cor. 1-3): Divisions centered around human leaders (e.g., Paul, Apollos, Cephas) weaken the church's witness. The remnant must be united in the gospel and recognize Christ as the sole foundation.



3 - *Lessons in the book of 1 Corinthians*

The Sanctuary and the Body

(1 Cor. 3:16-17; 6:19-20):

Because the church and the individual body are temples of the Holy Spirit, the remnant must maintain strict physical, moral, and spiritual purity.

Church Discipline (1 Cor. 5):

Open and unrepentant sin defiles the community. The remnant is instructed to deal faithfully with unrepentant members to preserve the purity of the church and encourage repentance.



Conclusion

Litigation Among Believers (1 Cor. 6:1-8): Taking fellow believers to secular courts is a defeat for the church. The remnant should resolve disputes internally, emphasizing mutual love and forgiveness.

Principles of Christian Liberty (1 Cor. 8): Paul warns against "knowledge" that inflates the ego. The remnant is called to put love for the brethren above "rights" or freedoms, ensuring that their actions do not cause weaker members to stumble.

BEWARE

For when you thus sin against the brethren, and wound their weak conscience, you sin against Christ

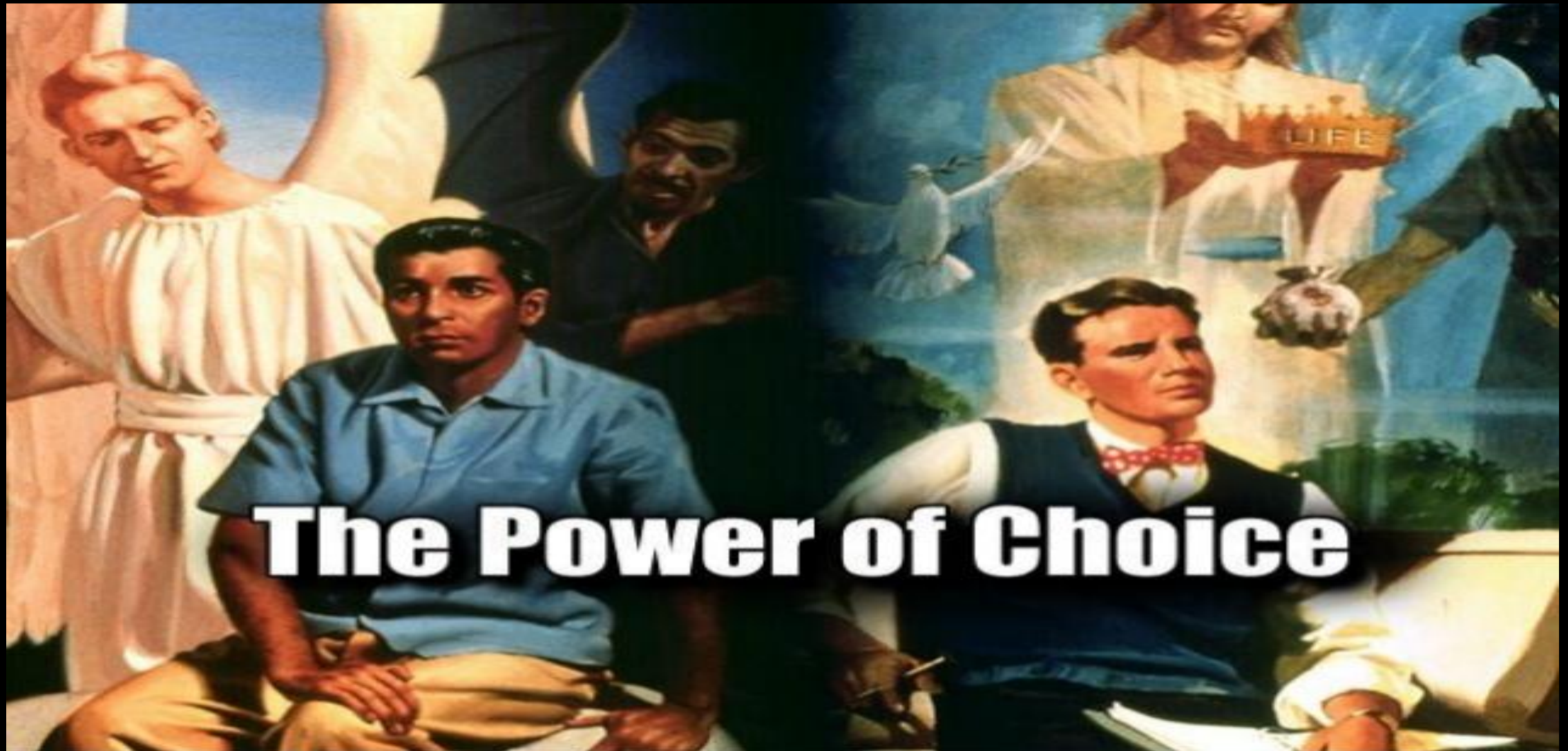

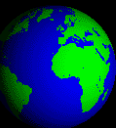
